Parish Income

CHURCH: Church income includes the generous gifts received from our weekly offertory, special contributions and other sacrificial giving from parishioners. In 2024, Church income includes parishioner donations to the Maintenance Fund of \$230,369. In 2023, Church income includes a total of \$247,215 received during a matching gift program which paid off entirely the Parish's debt due to the Diocese from our *Rooted In Christ Capital Building Campaign*.

FAITH FORMATION: The amount collected from student registration fees, retreats, special parish events, and a grant from the OLC Education Foundation. (OLCEF)

SCHOOL: School income includes tuition and registration fees for all grade levels, school lunch fees and the annual school fundraiser, and grants from the OLCEF. The school received several federal grants in 2023 and 2024.

Parish Expenses

CHURCH: Parish staff salaries, healthcare insurance, building insurance, office supplies, church supplies, candles, and worship supplies. Donations were given on behalf of our parish to organizations such as North Kent Connect, Consolata Sisters, Haiti Mission, Ethiopia, Holy Family Radio, & more. *Charitable donations from the parish totaled \$113,169 for a 9% tithe out of our offertory for the 2023-2024 fiscal year.* We also donate to: Christian Service, Catholic Relief Services, Rice Bowl Campaign, World Mission Sunday, Catholic Campaign for Human Development, and the Retirement Fund for Religious. Church expenses for the year ended June 30, 2024 include major maintenance costs of \$ 264,429, representing costs for the down payment on a new HVAC system, roof replacements, and other major maintenance.

FAITH FORMATION: Staff wages and benefits, text books, Bibles, materials for youth programs K-12, OCIA (formerly RCIA), Bible studies, retreats, and parish-wide events.

SCHOOL: Staff wages, benefits, lunch expenses, textbooks, computers, field trips, and teaching supplies.

Operations

The Parish financial statements of activity are presented on a modified basis and do not report depreciation.

Note: The Church transferred \$ 430,667 in 2024 and \$ 443,367 in 2023 to the school to balance the school budget. This school income and church expense is not reported in this statement of activity.

Plant/maintenance expenses have not been allocated separately to Church, Faith Formation, and school expense categories above.
