

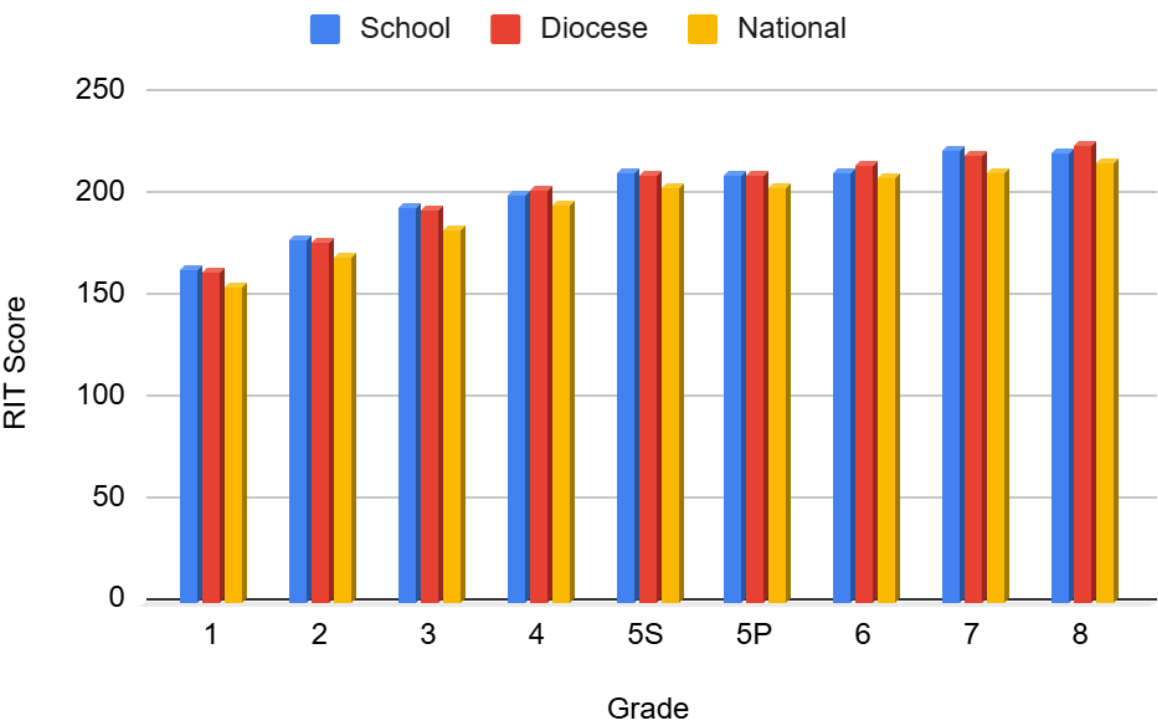
Student Growth Data

NWEA MAP is a computer-adaptive assessment, meaning it adjusts to the student's performance, that measures academic achievement and growth in subjects like reading and math. It is called MAP Growth and is used by teachers to understand individual student needs, tailor lessons, and track progress over time by administering the test multiple times a year.

MAPs scores are intended to show growth from fall to spring, so fall scores are a data point for teachers to use (with students) to set class growth goals for the school year. Fall scores can also be used in conjunction with other screening data to help identify individual student growth and support plans.

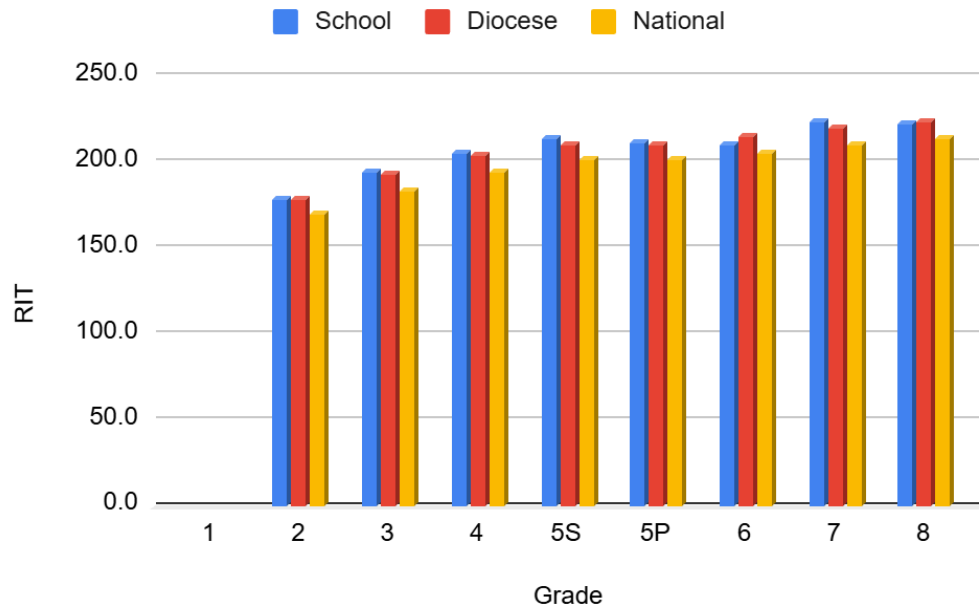

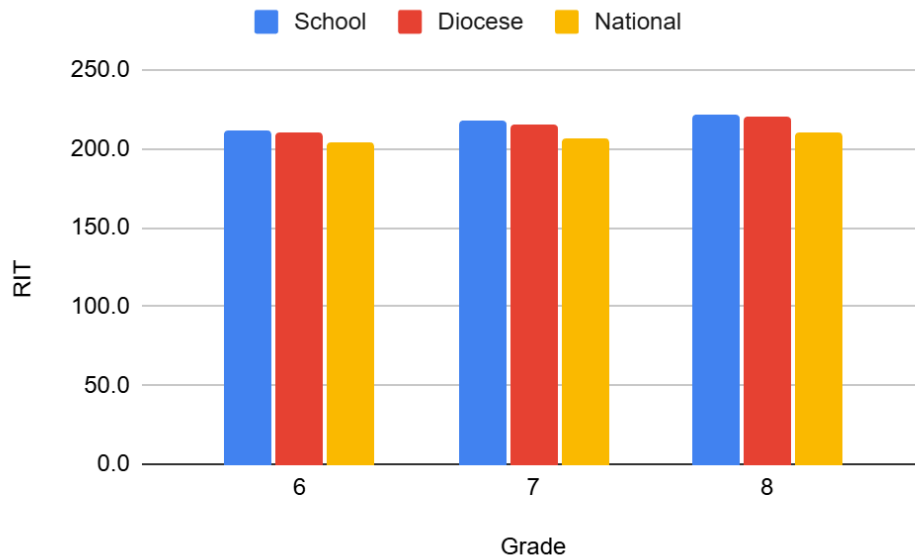
Fall 2025 RIT Averages Language Usage
